Both oral and written submissions regarding 9 the proposed regulations must be considered fully. 10 We will now open the floor to any questions 11 or comments. 12 CHAIRMAN COOK: And I'm assuming we've got 13 nothing in writing from anybody. 14 MS. VICKREY: That's correct. 15 CHAIRMAN COOK: Okay. Please proceed. 16 MR. Well, since there are 4 none, we can close the, the hearing and proceed with our 5 normal commission meeting. 6 MR. ORZECH: Actually, we have to wait on 7 that until 9:30. 8 CHAIRMAN COOK: Oh, okay. Well, we've all got 27 minutes of time to kill. 9 10 (An off the record discussion was held at this time.) 11 CHAIRMAN COOK: In light of the changes, or 12 the questions that Commissioner Collier is asking, let 13 us reconvene the hearing so that he can ask his 14 questions on the record and that Anna can answer them on 15 the record. So we're now back on the record. 16 MR. COLLIER: Anna, if you would be so kind 17 to tell me what's the difference between what we're 18 doing now and what is proposed here in these amendments? 19 MS. VICKREY: The current regulations are 20 that the somatic cell count limit is 750,000. We're reducing it to 400,000. The reason we're doing that is 21 22 because the new powdered plant wants to be able to sell 23 internationally, and the international requirements are less than 400,000 for somatic cell count. 24 25 So this really makes it a little bit easier

on our dairymen. They won't, they don't all have to 1 apply with USDA and have additional milk testing done as 2 long as the State has reduced those counts. 3 4 CHAIRMAN COOK: Who is providing the testing 5 at the reduced level, are we going to be doing that here, or is it still going to be the USDA? 6 7 MS. VICKREY: We'll continue just doing the 8 same testing we've always done. We've always pulled 9 samples, but our limits have just been 750,000. And now 10 the limits will be 400,000. And part of the process, we looked at, back 11 12 four years on the records, and even at 750,000 we never 13 had to de-grade anybody. And at 400,000 we would have 14 never had to de-grade anybody. Our somatic cell counts 15 are extremely low. In fact, Chad here was just telling 16 me that his are 90,000 right now. He's got very healthy 17 cows. 18 CHAIRMAN COOK: Okay. 19 MS. VICKREY: Okay. 20 MR. COLLIER: Thank you very much. 21 MS. VICKREY: You're very welcome. 22 CHAIRMAN COOK: Got that all clarified, 23 John? 24 MR. COLLIER: Very much so. 25 CHAIRMAN COOK: Okay. Should we close the
